EPIPHANY AND IT'S SEASON

Songs of thankfulness and praise, Jesus, Lord, To Thee we raise.

Manifested by the star To the sages from afar,

Branch of royal David's stem in Thy Birth at Bethlehem:

Anthems be to Thee addressed. God in man made manifest.

Epiphany is one of the oldest seasons in the Christian Church Year, second only to the season of Easter. This season of LIGHTS emphasizes Jesus' manifestation (or revealing) as God and man, The earliest Christians called the "Feast of Epiphany" the "Theophany" or revelation of God. When the Gentile Magi come to worship Jesus, they show that everyone now has access to God. Now all people, Gentile and Jew, can come to God's temple to worship, because Jesus is the NEW TEMPLE: God in flesh. The Epiphany of Our Lord (January 6th) or the 12th day of Christmas, marks the celebration of the visit of the Wisemen. Here are various practices and traditions; Like Christmas, the Epiphany of Our Lord, the Baptism of Our Lord, and the Transfiguration of Our Lord are festivals of Jesus.

Manifest at Jordan's stream, Prophet, Priest, and King supreme:

And at Cana wedding Guest in Thy Godhead manifest:


Manifest in power divine, Changing water into wine:

Anthems be to Thee Addressed. God in man made manifest.

The color for these festival days is WHITE, the color of divinity, purity and joy. The Sundays following after the Epiphany focus on the GROWTH of Jesus' ministry, so the color GREEN on the altar, pulpit, lectern and pastor's stole symbolizes that growth.

On the First Sunday after Epiphany, the Church celebrates the Baptism of Our Lord. The Father sent Jesus to bear the Sins of the world. So Jesus steps down into baptismal waters in the Jordan River to soak up the sins of the world: He is baptized so that our Baptism might be into His death and resurrection for the forgiveness of sins.

The Transfiguration, observed on the last Sunday in the Epiphany season, is a uniquely Lutheran gift to the Christian calendar. It celebrates the moment on the Mount of Transfiguration when three of Jesus' disciples glimpse their Lord in divine splendor, seeing Him as the center of the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). Jesus proclaims to His disciples, then and now, that He is the long-awaited One who has come to die for the sins of the world and be raised again in glory the following week.





The Transfiguration of Our Lord is the last Sunday before ASH WEDNESDAY and LENT begin. Because we give up singing "Alleluia" during LENT, at the close of the service on Transfiguration we say farewell to "Alleluia" with the hymn Alleluia, Song of Gladness.

Sun and moon shall darkened be, stars shall fall, the heavens shall flee;

Christ will then like Lightening shine, all will see His glorious sign;

All will then the trumpet hear, all will be confessed, God in man made manifest.

Grant us grace to see Thee, Lord, present in Thy Holy Word

Grace imitate Thee now and be Pure, as pure art Thou;

That we might become Like Thee at Thy Great Epiphany

And may Praise Thee, ever blest, God in man made manifest.

THE SEASON OF LENT

Begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14th, also Valentine's Day this year, and ends on Holy Saturday. We are invited into the story of Jesus' sacrificial death and His glorious resurrection. This gives proof that our salvation has been completed and our hope for life eternal with God is certain and secure. In the Early Church, Lent was a period of "preparation" first held for baptismal candidates. During this period, the candidates were examined in preparation for Baptism at the Easter VIGIL. Later, these 40 days were associated with Jesus' 40 days in the desert being tempted (Matthew 4:1-11) and with the 40 years the Children of Israel spent in the wilderness (Numbers 14:34), becoming a period of preparation for every Christian.

The Church is decorated in violet, the color of royalty and repentance. This period of repentance is marked by a purposeful "turning away" from our sin and "turning toward" Christ for His mercy and pardon. On Ash Wednesday, ashes on the forehead is a sign of repentance and a reminder that we, too, shall die. Black may be used to decorate the church this day.

Alleluia is the Hebrew word for "Praise the Lord". It is a joyous expression of faith in God. During Lent, we forego using this joyous response to focus on our need for repentance and faith. As in ADVENT, so in LENT, we do not sing the "Gloria in Excelsis" (Glory to God in the Highest) in worship. The focus is more on repentance. FASTING is giving up eating a particular meal to devote that time to prayer and meditation on the Word of God. The days of the week before Easter Sunday are called HOLY WEEK, including MAUNDY THURSDAY (remembering The Last Supper in the Upper Room with Jesus and the 12 disciples) and GOOD FRIDAY, focusing on the arrest, trial and Crucifixion of Christ. We observe Good Friday with a special SERVICE OF DARKNESS called "Tenebrae".


LWML....News


QUILTERS NEEDED

Tuesdays from 9:00-11:00 a.m. volunteers work together to provide warmth and comfort for those in need. One of the main tasks is tying the quilts, which is just pulling crochet cotton through the quilt using a needle and then knotting it. It

is a great time to sit with a friend and chat while working to provide warmth and comfort for others. Your help would be greatly appreciated. Please come and see what we do. You so not need to call ahead, just show up! Remember to sign in at the office before coming downstairs to the quilt area. Also remember to sign out when you leave.

THANK YOU for all the generous donations keeping quilters supplied and busy making quilt for Lutheran World Relief. At this time we have sufficient fabric, so we ask that you <u>do not</u> bring any more fabric until we have used up much of our supply. We can always use colored or printed sheets. Our biggest need is for fillers for the middle to provide warmth. <u>DONATIONS</u> <u>of BLANKETS AND MATTRESS PADS</u> are still needed for the middles of quilts. Please be sure these are <u>freshly laundered</u> before donating. If you have some other donation that might work for a middle, please check first with a quilter. Fleece is no longer accepted by LWR, because it is found to pollute the water supply in areas that have no filtration. We can also use donations of crochet cotton in bright colors. We have sufficient white and neutral colors for tying. Donations can be left downstairs in the room to the left of the stage.


